### ENROLMENTS FOR PREP AND OTHER YEAR LEVELS 2025



We have begun to take Prep and other year level enrolments for the 2025 school year. Enrolment forms can be located on our website or can be collected from the office. Appointments can be booked by ringing the school. Please ensure that whether you are residing in or out of catchment as a new or

existing parent, we want your enrolment forms sooner than later.

Students who do not reside in catchment will be added to a waiting list.

#### READING

Learning to read is the most important academic skill children master at school. Improvement in reading ability is the major focus for every child, every day. Evidence gathered over the past decade, from over 30 000 schools, highlights the following worthwhile findings:

#### • A minimum of 15-30 minutes a day of independent reading is essential.

The 'sweet spot' for independent, engaged reading is maximised at 30 minutes. Reading gain is still made after this point but to maximise reading growth aim for 30 minutes every day.

#### • Girls outpace boys in reading.

From Year 4 onwards, girls on average read over 100 000 words more per year than boys. Cumulatively, girls read close to a million words more than boys by the end of high school. In your family you can support your child in achieving their full potential by both encouraging boys to read and making set times for daily reading in your home. Boys can be encouraged to read when they see their dad, grandfather enjoy reading – they won't see it as a "girl thing".

#### PUNCTUALITY

At Burleigh Heads State School, we believe that children learn best when they arrive punctually as it enables them to effectively embrace their learning for the day. When children arrive late regularly, not only does it affect their learning and progress, but it also creates distractions for their teacher and peers.

We encourage parents to consider the positive impact of punctuality on learning.

### The first lesson of the day begins at 9.00 a.m. (Lessons are often of 1 hour duration.)

### Late by 5 minutes?

That results in is loss of 8% of the learning in the first lesson of the day. This is when children get organised and ready for the main teaching activity after the bell.

### Late by 10 minutes?

That results in loss of 16% of the learning in the first lesson of the day. This is when the teacher is 30% into the main teaching activity of the first lesson of the day. It is during this time that the teacher begins to introduce the lesson learning objectives, teaches new concepts and explains what the children are required to do during independent activities.

### Late by 15 minutes?

That results in loss of 25% of the learning in the first lesson of the day. We classify this as substantial loss of learning. Your child may find it difficult to work confidently during the independent activities in this lesson as he/she has lost out on the main teacher explanation time.

We do recognise that occasionally pupils will be late due to extenuating circumstances. However, arriving late at school regularly can impact on your child's progress over time.

### EARLY ARRIVAL

We are seeing more students arriving early to school each day. Students do not need to be here at school before 8:30am. We understand parents work and so, we provide a before school care facility for that to occur.

Children who do come earlier are expected to sit in the undercover area near the office and wait quietly and patiently until they are dismissed at 8:30. (This is a supervised area from 8.15am)

Parents, we are asking for your support to ensure the safety and wellbeing of our students by respecting and acknowledging these times.

#### UNIFORMS

Recently we have noticed the wearing of various jumpers and shoes of different colours and fashion trends. Whilst I am partial to a great Spiderman jumper myself, it is not the agreed uniform for the school.

#### A maroon jumper or jacket and all black shoes are the agreed school uniform.

We need to remind students of our school expectations for their uniform and will be doing so on assemblies and general messages over the next few weeks as it gets colder. Parents, if you are missing some jumpers our Lost Property basket is overflowing with no name items needing to find their owners. Please take 10 minutes to come and check it out in the old hall. (Items that are named will be returned to classrooms.)

### **GETTING ALONG WITH OTHERS ... Do the High Five!**

Whilst "getting along with others" is one of the key components of our social-emotional education program at Burleigh Heads State School, there will be times where students require strategies to deal with social situations or confrontation that are challenging. As such, we encourage students and parents to discuss the "High 5 Strategy" for such situations.

The High 5 strategy can be summarised as below:

- 1. Ignore!
- 2. Talk Friendly!
- 3. Walk Away!
- 4. Talk Firmly!
- 5. Report!

### IGNORE

- Pretend you didn't hear it.
- Do not make eye contact.
- Maintain positive body posture (calm, confident).
- Think positive self-esteem statements.
- Count to five in your head slowly.
- Take deep breaths.
- WE CAN USE ROLE PLAY TO SHOW WHAT IGNORING LOOKS LIKE, SOUNDS LIKE AND MAY FEEL LIKE.

### TALK FRIENDLY

- Use a calm voice.
- Maintain eye contact.
- Confident body language.
- Maintain relatively close body proximity.
- Use "I" statements I feel . . . . when you . . . . . because....
- WE CAN USE ROLE PLAY TO SHOW WHAT TALKING FRIENDLY LOOKS LIKE, SOUNDS LIKE AND MAY FEEL LIKE.

### WALK AWAY

- Stand tall, head up high.
- Mouth closed.
- Look confident.
- Do not use eye contact.
- Walk somewhere, preferably towards a congested area or to a safety zone (teacher).
- Do not look back. Walk confidently, don't run!
- WE CAN USE ROLE PLAY TO SHOW WHAT WALKING AWAY LOOKS LIKE, SOUNDS LIKE AND MAY FEEL LIKE.

### **TALK FIRMLY**

- As per Talk Friendly but use a strong voice.
- Use an assertive voice, slightly raised.
- Tell them to stop it.
- Re-state your "I" statement. e.g. I said . . . .
- State the consequences of continued bullying.
- WE CAN USE ROLE PLAY TO SHOW WHAT TALKING FIRMLY LOOKS LIKE, SOUNDS LIKE AND MAY FEEL LIKE.

### REPORT

- Walk away and tell a staff member.
- Go to a safety zone.
- Bystanders support and report.
- Report, report, report until somebody listens.
- WE CAN USE ROLE PLAY TO SHOW WHAT REPORTING LOOKS LIKE, SOUNDS LIKE AND MAY FEEL LIKE.

Children need to be aware that, even as a victim of anti-social behaviour, choosing to retaliate in a negative way can often result in serious consequences for themselves also. Children practise these strategies with their class teacher and are encouraged to use them to resolve conflict.


